Huntsville's Full Service Filling Stations

Do you remember cool art deco or country cottage style full service gas stations? A time when gas was 30 cents a gallon and the attendant would pump gas, check the oil and clean your windshield? I barely remember and I'm over 60.

Thankfully some forward thinking Huntsville photographers of the 1940s & 50s documented many of Huntsville's full service gas stations of the time. These photographs made their way to the Huntsville/Madison County Public Library Heritage Room.

Thanks to these photographs we can appreciate not only the beauty of those stations, but also the mid-century cars and gasoline pumps. Notice the old signs and imagine a time when you did not even have to get out of your car to get a fill-up. As a matter of fact, gas stations were known as "filling stations" and many a teenager could count on a part-time job pumping gas and checking oil levels.

Traffic Lights

The earliest traffic signals did not consist of the tri-colored light system we use today. Rather, the semaphore signal, a method of visual signaling, usually by means of flags or lights was operated, either manually or automatically, at busy intersections. The first semaphore traffic signal, patented in 1923, consisted of a mechanical device that rotated "Stop" or "Go" flags for the approaching traffic. Originally, police officers were assigned the duty of holding traffic flags, but the new semaphore signal provided a hand-crank for rotating the flags. Many semaphore signals featured lights and bells for added safety. Bells would ring when the semaphore signals were changing to alert drivers. Red or green lights were also added to the flags for easier visibility. The semaphore signal was used until the four-way, tri-colored light signal became the standard in 1935.
