





NAR From the Past - 1972


Here are a few pages from the July/August Auto Antiquarian News, highlighting the 1972 NAR local show, June 9-11. It was held for the first time on the grounds of the (then) Alabama Space and Rocket center. (Note that the S&RC was also home to later local and national NAR shows up to the late 80s until their building programs extended to what had been the show field.)

The show featured 148 cars, 127 of which were judged. The judging classes generally followed those of AACA National Judging, for cars up through 1938. There were also two Special Interest classes, 1939-1948 and 1949-1960. The latter class sported a '56 Thunderbird, '58 Cadillac and two '57 Chevrolets, barely used cars at that point! Best of Show was awarded to Tom Smith with his '29 Model A, Murray-bodied 4-door sedan.

This was a three-day event, with entertainment, a flea market, Ladies' Luncheon and closing banquet. Apparently there was a charge for spectator admission, though there was some issue with "crowd control" so that not every visitor contributed. The bottom line for the show turned out to be a \$15.00 loss, roughly ten cents per entrant and 1% of the overall show budget, not a bad deal in the grand scheme.







March/April 1972 Summer's Calendar
