I know many of y'all are on the edge of your seat wondering how the thrust bearing journey for our 1927 Marmon Model L turned out. NAR president Jeff Slagle was able to machine out the old brass bushing and replace it with brass. Assembly showed that the previous restorer had really forced the connection of the three elements involved, generator, spacer shaft, and water pump and with the new bushing, I couldn't get it all to fit, with the generator in the travel path for the fan. I chose to shorten the spacer shaft between the Generator and water pump by drilling a new hole. A little reaming and greasing and the whole thing got assembled and lines up pretty nicely. Thank you Ed, Wayne, and Jeff for your input and assistance. Getting the car hot and doing valves this morning.

Classic Car Quiz - Answers

A1. Lee Iacocca

As Ford reeled from the Edsel disaster, rising star Lee Iacocca had a revolutionary idea: create a car that was stylish, fast and affordable. That combination proved to be a huge hit with Baby Boomers, and the rest is history.

A2. AC Ace

Carroll Shelby was eager to establish himself as an automaker, and he approached AC about making a car body that would accept an American V-8. The combination proved to be explosive.

A3. Comedy routine

Rowan & Martin's Laugh-In TV was a popular program back in the day, and it featured a recurring routine called Here Come de Judge. The Pontiac GTO Judge was stripped down as a way to compete with the low-cost Plymouth Road Runner.

A4. Designer and builder

Volkswagen recruited Italian coachbuilder Ghia to design this 2+2, while German coachbuilder Karmann constructed each one by hand, making the vehicle a true masterpiece.

A5. French Riviera

Riviera is a Latin word that means "coastline." In France, it's a famous tourist destination known for glitzy yet sophisticated fun on the coast, something you normally wouldn't associate with a Buick.

A6. Monocoque

The MGA and T-types from MG all had a body-on-frame construction, making the MGB a standout. The lighter and stronger construction boosted performance considerably.

A7. Trans Am

The Boss name has only been used a few times in the Mustang's history, and it commands great respect among fans of the pony car.

A8. New body

Not only was the sports car wearing different skin, it also gained a better top with optional power assist, glass side windows and an optional hardtop, if you didn't like the wind.

A9. Owner of the company

Sir David Brown was the owner of Aston Martin from 1947 to 1972, which covered the launch of the DB series and the first several versions of it.

A10. Cartoon Road Runner's beep beep

Plymouth partnered with Warner Brothers on the Road Runner, not only borrowing the cartoon bird's signature sound, but also using its as spokes-bird in commercials.

A11. Three two-barrel Holley carbs

To keep with SCCA competition rules, Dodge created the Challenger T/A, but decided to make it a real street-legal beast by adding the Holley two-barrel carbs, called the Six Pack, and an Edelbrock aluminum intake manifold.

A12. Fiberglass

Depending on how you look at it, the Avanti was either a brilliant accident or a monumental disaster, and was the last big effort by the dying automaker.



North Alabama Region of the Antique Automobile Club of America Website: www.naraaca.org For the last 75 years or so, British tabloids often - almost as if it were compulsory - dragged out the tale of when Queen Elizabeth II's wartime service experience. See, unlike other women in the royalty, Elizabeth didn't shy away from service during World War II, and instead she donned a uniform and learned not only how to drive heavy trucks for the war effort but also how to wrench on them. So with her death today at the age of 96, after 70 years on the throne, let's repeat the tale one last time.

As the Evening Standard wrote, the royal family chose not to flee from England to Canada during the war years "in solidarity with those living through the Blitz," and Elizabeth famously addressed the nation via radio in the early years of the war. While she'd been given the role of honorary colonel of the Grenadier Guards on her 16th birthday, two years later, she decided to join the Auxiliary Territorial Service, a branch of the British Army that initially employed women as cooks and postal workers but eventually expanded their duties to include rocket and missile data acquisition, transport, signal operation, and equipment maintenance.

She joined the ATS as a second subaltern in March 1945 and her father, King George VI, reportedly ordered that she not be given any special treatment or rank - though she still slept in Windsor Castle instead of in the barracks with her colleagues in the ATS. As part of her training, she had to pass a driving test, learn to read maps, and took instruction on repairing vehicles. British press at the time apparently dubbed her "Princess Auto Mechanic." She did receive a promotion to Junior Commander, but her time in the ATS was short - VE Day came in May 1945, putting an end to her service.

While Elizabeth doubtless gave up wrenching on trucks after her service, she continued to slip behind the wheel as often as possible for a head of state, even up until late last year, against the advice of her doctors, and only gave up driving on public roads in 2019. She likely gave up driving military trucks long before that, though.


